"Paternity leave and mothers' labour supply: a cross-country analysis of European countries",

Abstract: *Father-specific leaves have become a common tool in developed countries to address gender inequalities that arise after childbirth, but it is unclear how parents respond to these policies. In this paper, I use Difference-in-Differences and triple difference strategies with data from the European Labour Force Survey to study the impact of paternity leave policies on mothers' labour supply in thirteen European countries. I find that the reforms increased fathers' leave taking and the probability for mothers to be employed 2-3 years after childbirth. I find no evidence that paternity leave affected time use within the household or social norms regarding mothers, i.e. the two main mechanisms through which the reforms could increase mothers' employment.*
